# Functions of the Teaching Council | Matatū Aotearoa

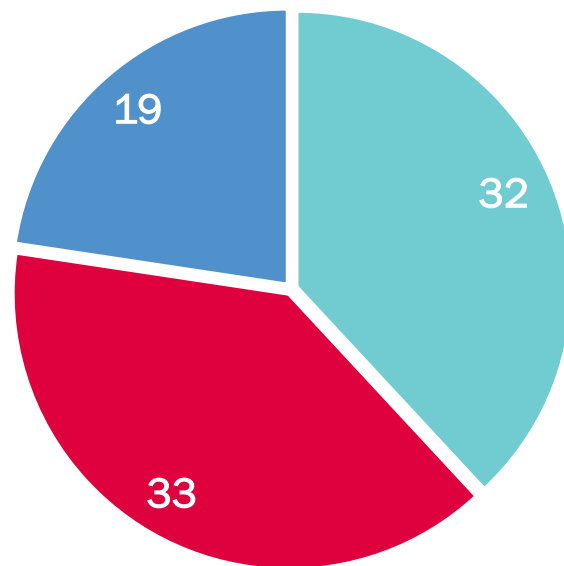
- **Pou Here Tōmua** – establishing and maintaining standards for initial teacher education and undertaking Initial Teacher Education programme approvals
- **Pou Whai Rēhitanga** – becoming registered and certificated as a teacher
- **Pou Mataara** – ensuring high-quality teacher practice
- **Pou Matatika** – ensuring high standards of ethical behaviour
- **Pou Tikanga Matatika, Ngā Paerewa** – establishing and maintaining the Code of Professional Responsibility and Standards for the Teaching Profession
- **Pou Aro Whakamua** – steering the future direction of teaching



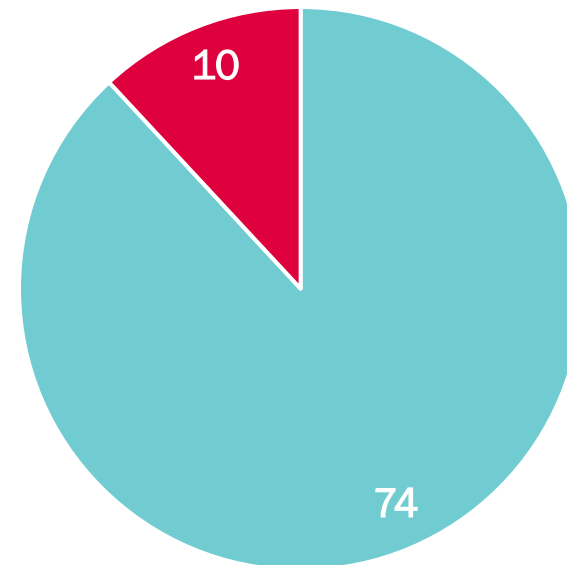
# EoY 2022 Programme Approvals

Approved programmes by sector

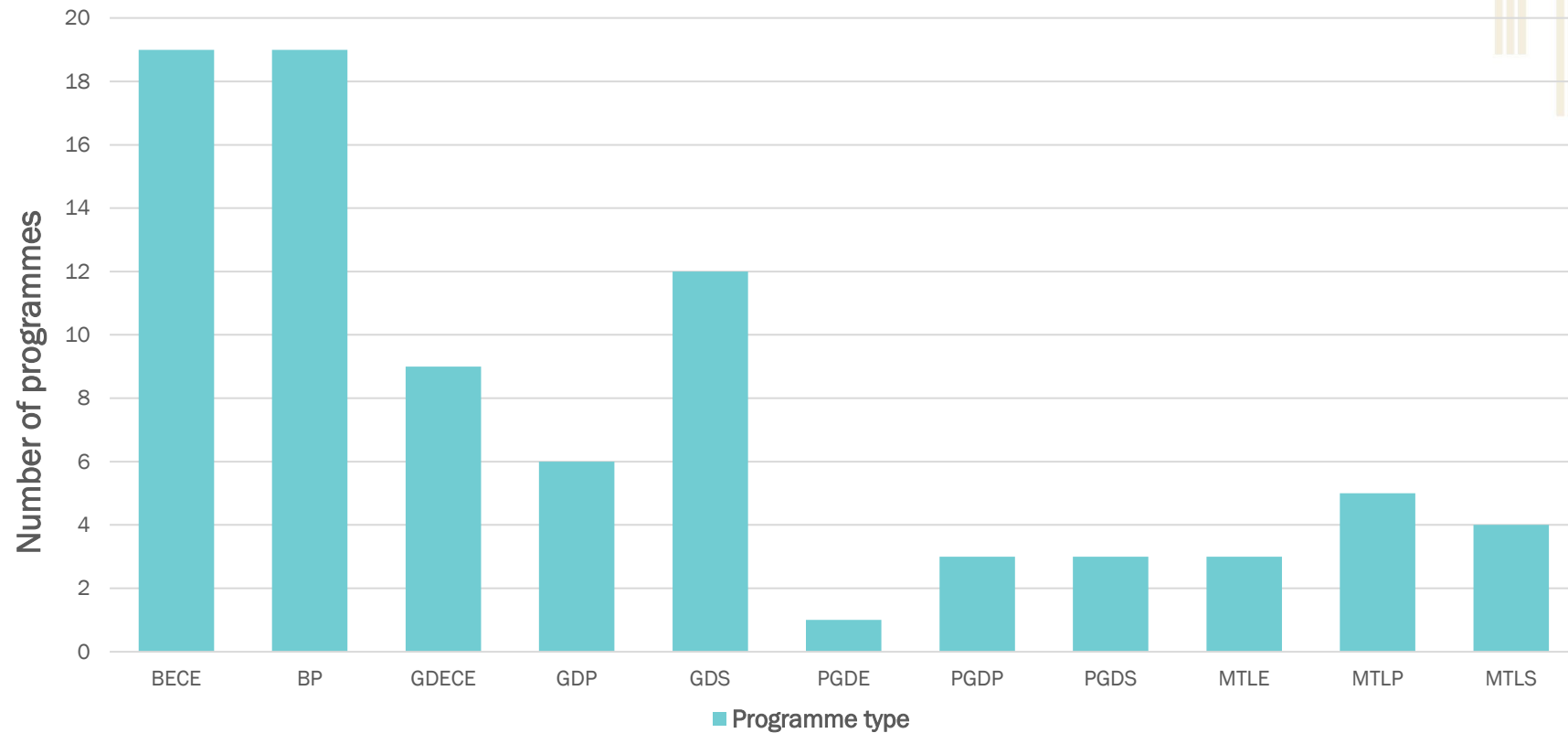


Approved programmes by medium

## Why are we consulting on a new approach to ITE programme monitoring, review, and moderation?

- ❑ **Meeting our legislated functions** : ensuring that the standards of the qualification that lead to teacher registration are maintained
- ❑ **Meeting commitments in the ITE Strategy** : emphasise an approach to programme development and implementation that ensures ITE graduates are ready to teach and well equipped to continue their journey to full certification.
- ❑ **With the completion of programme approvals under the ITE Requirements it is timely to now focus on quality assurance processes for these programme**

The Council convened an external working group to assist us in designing an approach on MRM (Oct 2022)



Two hui with external working group to get feedback on draft MRM model (Nov 2022 and January 2023)



The Council develops draft consultation document and receives feedback from the working group (Feb – March 2023)



From 5 April to the release of the consultation document, Council staff will refine the document to be shared with the sector

- Major change to a programme
- To make an application.
- Outcome

# ITE Interim Monitoring – (in conjunction with NZQA)

- Relates to ITE Requirement 9.2
- In 'transition space' for 2020-2023.
- Interim mode recognises needs for low burden during challenging years.
- Still working in conjunction with NZQA and external monitors for non-university programmes. Teaching Council external monitor for universities.
